CAT AND MOUSE

The people of Ancient Egypt grew a lot of wheat. It rarely rains in Egypt so the soil is very dry. Every year, they would wait for the River Nile to flood after the rains. Then they would sow the wheat in the wet, muddy ground. After the harvest, they would put the wheat into big storehouses. This meant they would have enough to eat for the rest of the year.

Mice like wheat. They became a real pest for the Egyptians. Because of this, the people of Egypt started to use cats to help them to protect their food. At the time, there were lots of cats living wild in Egypt. They were cousins of the great lions and every bit as fierce in their own way.

Cats became really good at hunting the mice. The Egyptians then began to keep them as pets. They loved them and even had a god of cats in their temples!

When the Ancient Romans came to Egypt, they too became fond of cats. Soon cats began to spread right across the Roman Empire. Imagine that your pet cat at home has a history that goes all the way back to the Ancient Romans and Ancient Egyptians. ■

Carrauntoohill

Carrauntoohill, in County Kerry, is the highest mountain in Ireland. It is 1,038 metres high. That is more than a kilometre! It is part of the Macgillycuddy's Reeks mountain range. The nearest large town is Killarney. There is a big metal cross on the **summit** (top) of the mountain. The cross is five metres high.

Many people visit Kerry to see the lovely mountains, lakes and valleys there. Some people like to climb the mountains. Carrauntoohill is a favourite one to try. It is not an easy mountain to climb, however, and only the best climbers should try it.

There are lots of steep, tricky parts to get past on the mountain. Some of these even have scary names like the Devil's Ladder or the Hag's Glen. The weather can be a problem too. Thick clouds can roll in from the Atlantic Ocean and these are like the thickest fog. Climbers often cannot see where they are going. Sometimes people get hurt on the mountain because of this.

If there is an accident, some very brave people will go to help hurt climbers. This group is called The Kerry Mountain Rescue Team. These heroes know the mountain better than anybody. They will find and help anyone who is lost or hurt on the mountain. ■

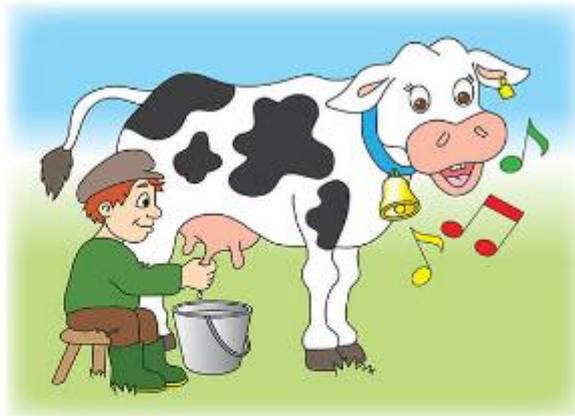
